

Non-Credit International Certificate Program

Join American University and the Washington Semester Program for a one semester (or year-long) academic practicum experience in Washington, DC. Through seminar courses and a practicum, students gain both academic and real-world work experience.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

SEMINAR

DAYS EACH

Through lectures led by AU professors and class discussions, students learn the theory and real-world practice of their field. Students meet with guest speakers and experts and go on site visits to gain a behind-the-scenes understanding of their seminar topic. Over the course of the semester, students will have approximately 120 hours of seminar class time.

PRACTICUM

DAYS EACH Students will gain real-world practicum experience at a diverse range of organizations, government agencies, or businesses in the DC-area. Over the course of the semester student will have approximately 280 hours of practicum time.

TRANSCRIPTS & GRADES

Upon completion of the International Certificate Program, students will be graded and receive an American University transcript of the courses and grades. The transcript will note that courses are non-credit.

Grades will be based on class attendance and participation, completion of readings and assignments, and demonstrated efforts to achieve established academic and professional learning goals.

As part of the partnership agreement, Washington Semester Program staff will work with partner schools to provide course syllabi, so partner institution staff can review content to issue home school credit to the students' transcripts.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply for the program, students should visit applynowspexs.american.edu and submit the following information:

- >>> Completion of the online International Certificate application
- >>> Nomination from the home school
- >>> Official university transcript
- >>> Official copy of proof of English Proficiency

Proof of English Proficiency will be accepted in the form of the TOEFL, IELTS or Pearson's Test of English (PTE). Minimum scores for admission are: Paper Based TOEFL - 550, Internet Based TOEFL - 80 (Minimum of 18 on Speaking & Listening), IELTS - 6.5, or PTE - 59.
