
Our Vision

LOCATION, LOCATION, LOCATION

Our location is an incredible draw. We're in one of the world's best areas for outdoor recreation and just one mile from the shores of Monterey Bay, the largest marine sanctuary on the West Coast. This means lots of opportunities for environmental study, not to mention surfing, hiking, kayaking, sailing, biking, hanging out at the beach and more.

Incredible Learning Environment

Monterey Bay isn't just for scientists and surfers (though we have our share). The communities that surround our campus offer a wide range of cultural activities, while maintaining a friendly, small-town feel. Plus, all the major metropolitan attractions of the San Francisco Bay Area are just a two-hour drive away.

In short, Cal State Monterey Bay offers an incredible learning environment. From our campus, you can look out on the lush agricultural fields of the Salinas Valley, the historic city of Monterey, and the bay itself – all places where students apply their learning through internships, service learning and research.

A Rich History

Our campus is on the site of the former Fort Ord Army base, which has some perks. For example, the residence hall rooms are much bigger than average because they are in remodeled officers quarters. In keeping with our green philosophy, we've reused whenever possible, so you'll find many bits and pieces of this history all over campus.



STUDENT LIFE

One of the only truly residential campuses in the CSU, Cal State Monterey Bay provides a rich campus life experience and vibrant community for students to participate in.

The heart of campus is the Tanimura & Antle Family Memorial Library, a green-certified building (just one more example of CSUMB's commitment to sustainability). It's common to see faculty holding office hours in the coffee shop, study groups meeting in the skyboxes that jut into the upper levels of the atrium, and students bent over laptops in the quiet study zones on either side of the main stacks.

The library is also home to the university's robust range of academic support services. If a student is looking for a Spanish tutor, a time management workshop, or a new undergraduate research opportunity, all can be found in the Student Success wing of the library.

When not studying, students can participate in one of the over 50 clubs and groups, or burn off some energy playing intramural sports (dodgeball is a favorite). The university's outdoor recreation program helps students take advantage of the variety of outdoor adventures the Central Coast has to offer – and rents bikes for getting around campus and into town by the day, week, and semester (another way to be green).

The university fields 13 NCAA Division II athletic teams, and already the young athletics program has brought home a few championship trophies – including a national title in men's golf in 2011.
