Please note: All fees are subject to change without prior notice.

^{**}Saint Martin's University grants one or two tuition waivers to global partner university exchange students according to the MOU between SMU and the global partner university. Tuition-waiver students who wish to take undergraduate classes must provide proof of English proficiency (minimum score of TOEFL 71 iBT, TOEFL 525 ITP, TOEIC 700, IELTS 6.0 or Duolingo 95). Students who do not meet the English requirement (concurrent status) may be eligible to take two undergraduate classes and two ESL classes during the exchange program. Students who do not meet the concurrent status requirements are only able to take ESL classes during the exchange program.
